



# Bruno Jochum

**Executive Director | Climate Action Accelerator** 

Bruno Jochum is the director and founder of the Climate Action Accelerator.

He has been involved in emergency medical humanitarian action for 20 years, having worked all over the world, from Iran to Rwanda to South Africa. After several years in the field with Médecins du Monde as well as with Médecins sans Frontières, he became successively Programme Manager, Director of Operations and then Director General of Médecins sans Frontières in Geneva (OCG), an NGO employing 7000 staff and a budget of 260 million CHF. Before launching the initiative, he was a Global Fellow at the Geneva Centre for Security Policy, where the Accelerator was incubated.

Bruno has a degree from Sciences Po Strasbourg in Political Studies and holds a Master's in Political Science from University of Paris I: Panthéon–Sorbonne and in International Public Law from the University of Nancy. His awareness of the human impacts of climate change and his taste for challenge led him to launch this new non–profit initiative, which aims to make a difference by operationalising climate action and provoking a domino effect among organisations in society.





# Joyeeta Gupta

Professor of Law and Policy in water and environmental resources | University of Amsterdam

Joyeeta Gupta is the 2023 winner of the Spinoza Prize, the highest prize in the Netherlands for academic work (Euro 1.5 Million). She co-chaired UNEP's Global Environment Outlook-6 (2016-2021), presented to governments at the United Nations Environment Assembly in 2019, and won the Association of American Publishers PROSE award for Environmental Science. She is presently co-chair of the Earth Commission (2019-2022), and has a plenary presentation to the World Economic Forum in Davos in 2023. She is member of the Global Commission on the Economics of Water (2022-2024), which is preparing a report for the 2023 UN Water Conference.

In 2022, she was awarded the 2022 Piers Sellers Prize for world leading contribution to solution–focused climate research, recent world–leading research outputs and evidence of resulting impacts; application of an interdisciplinary approach; and focus on climate solutions, Priestley International Centre for Climate, Leeds University.

She is full professor of environment and development in the global south at the University of Amsterdam and IHE Delft Institute for Water Education. She is also the Faculty Professor on Sustainability (2019–2024). She leads the programme group on Governance and Inclusive Development. She was lead author in the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change which won the 2007 Nobel Peace Prize with Al Gore and of the Millennium Ecosystem Assessment which won the Zaved Second Prize. She has published several books, is on the editorial board of seven journals, and has (co-)edited 13 Special Issues. She has successfully supervised 29 PhDs and is currently supervising 20 PhD students in the areas of climate change, forest, food/fish, water and disaster governance as well as in development challenges such as food governance and child marriage.





### Gilles Carbonnier

Vice-President | International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC)

Gilles Carbonnier is the vice-president of the ICRC. He also is a member of the Climate Action Accelerator's Board.

Since 2007, he has been a professor of development economics at the Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies (Geneva). Prior to that he worked with the ICRC in Iraq, Ethiopia, El Salvador and Sri Lanka, and served as an economic adviser at the ICRC's headquarters.

His expertise lies in international cooperation, the economic dynamics of armed conflict, and the nexus between natural resources and development.





### David Nabarro

Strategic Director | 4SD Foundation

Professor Sir David Nabarro is Co-Director of the Institute of Global Health Innovation and Professor of Global Health at Imperial College London. He is strategic director of the Geneva-based Foundation Skills, Systems and Synergies for Sustainable Development (4SD). 4SD accompanies practitioners as they advance transformation of complex and contested people-centred systems.

David has served as Special Envoy of the World Health Organization on COVID-19 (since early 2020) and has led the Food Workstream in the UN Global Crisis Response Group on Food, Energy and Finance (GCRG) since March 2022. The GCRG equips the UN to respond to difficulties faced by people and nations due to increases in the cost-of-living, exacerbated by climate change and conflicts.





# Béatrice Godefroy

Director Policy Engagement | Climate Action Accelerator

A seasoned professional in humanitarianism, security and peace, Béatrice Godefroy brings to the Climate Action Accelerator 20 years of experience in the area of public policy, research, strategic management, and project development with a commitment to improve the fate of populations caught in crisis.

Beatrice currently holds the position of Policy Engagement
Director where one of her main areas of focus is the amplification
of the climate transformation of the humanitarian sector.
Throughout her journey as a humanitarian worker, she was
deployed in multiple conflict-affected countries, and served in
several leadership roles at Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF). Most
recently, Beatrice was Europe Director at the Center for Civilians in
Conflict (CIVIC), in charge of CIVIC's engagement with European
Governments, the European Union, and NATO in view of promoting
better policies and practices to improve the protection of civilians.

She holds an MA in Public Policy from Princeton University and graduated from Sciences Po Paris.





#### Kathrine Vad

Outgoing Environment and Climate Change Advisor International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC)

Kathrine Vad has close to 20 years of experience in implementing solutions to the climate and environmental crises.

From May 2017 to October 2023, Kathrine was the ICRC's Environment and Climate Change advisor. Kathrine has been a catalyst for the ICRC's environmental sustainability agenda; she has notably supported the institution in adopting an ambitious GHG emission reduction target, and lead the construction of the ICRC's environmental roadmap.

Before the ICRC, Kathrine worked as an environmental management consultant and sustainability expert for governmental bodies and the private sector.





# Thomas Thompson

Director Supply Chain Strategic Engagement | World Food Programme (WFP)

Born in California, Thomas Thompson is currently assigned to WFP HQ responsible for charting the way forward for WFPs supply chain of the future. Tommy has been with WFP for 29 years with over 20 of that in the field. Much of this experience has been in emergency work in austere environments and challenging operations.

Tommy began his WFP career in Sudan in the early 90s, and has done all things Logistics and supply chain, including managing air operations, river deliveries, procuring bulk grains, and managing interagency offices, much of it in war zones. From Operation Lifeline Sudan, the Indian Ocean Tsunami, building roads in South Sudan, Somalia drought response, Global Logistics Cluster Coordinator, and Ebola response, Beirut blast response, Tommy is one of WFP's more experienced field operatives. His most recent field assignment was as WFP's Emergency Coordinator in Northern Ethiopia.





# Tewodros Asresehegn

Program Component Manager | Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ)

Tewodros Gebreegziabher Asresehegn holds the role of Program Component Manager for the GIZ – ClimateSensitive for Land Management (CLM) project. Simultaneously, he is pursuing his PhD at Wageningen University and Research.

His doctoral research centers on identifying viable routes toward the sustainable restoration of agroecosystems. Tewodros is a seasoned expert in natural resource management, with a wealth of experience in Ethiopia's sustainable land management program.

Presently, he spearheads a team of senior advisors collaborating with the Ministry of Agriculture to implement the CLM project. This initiative focuses on strengthening community-based institutions aimed at ensuring sustainable land management in the highlands of Ethiopia.





#### Claire Fehrenbach

Engagement, Impact and Communication Director | Nutriset

Claire Fehrenbach is the Engagement, Impact and Communication Director for the Nutriset Group.

Nutriset develops and produces nutritional solutions to save lives, prevent and treat malnutrition in the most affected countries.

She first joined the NGO sector during the Kosovo war, and then worked in Africa with refugees and landmines victims. Then from NGO headquarters, she influenced donors and raised institutional funds to develop humanitarian and development projects.

As Oxfam France Executive Director from 2014 to 2018, she was fully mobilized for the Paris agreement in 2015, and remains highly committed to reduce carbon footprint while saving lives.





### **Charlotte Dufour**

Senior independent expert on sustainable food systems and co-Chair of Groupe URD

Charlotte Dufour has been working on nutrition and food systems for over 20 years, starting with Action contre la Faim (in Afghanistan, HQ and Ethiopia) and Groupe URD.

She worked for the FAO from 2005 to 2017, in Afghanistan and at its headquarters on nutritionsensitive food systems.

She is an independent consultant since 2017 and currently works with the UNDP-hosted Conscious Food Systems Alliance.

She contributes to the 4SD Foundation Immersions on Living Systems leadership and the Territorial Food Project for the Cluny region (France). Charlotte is the co-Chair of Groupe URD's Board and co-founder of Listening Inspires.





#### Dr Jemilah Mahmood

Executive Director | Sunway Center for Planetary Health

Dr. Mahmood is a medical professional with decades of experience managing crises in health, disasters and conflict settings, since founding the international humanitarian organization, MERCY Malaysia.

She is currently Professor and Executive Director of the Sunway Centre for Planetary and holds various advisory and board roles, including Roche, Government of Malaysia, Malaysia Red Crescent Society, Norwegian Refugee Council, and the World Economic Forum's Global Future Council of Responsible Resource Use.

Dr Mahmood is also the recipient of numerous awards including the 2019 ASEAN Prize, 2013 Bahrain's Isa Award for Humanity, and the King-Ikeda Award for community development and peacebuilding, amongst others.





#### Fawzia Rasheed

Senior Advisor, Climate and Environment Lead | Aga Khan Health Services

Fawzia Rasheed is a Programme and Policy Analyst with a science research background. She is Climate and Environment Lead for Aga Khan Health Services, and holds professorships at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine and the James P. Grant School of Public Health.

She is also a member of the Executive Committee for the Lancet Commission on Sustainable Health Care working on KPIs for global use. Fawzia has worked with over 20 governments. She was Senior Policy Advisor to an intergovernmental South–South initiative of 16 Ministries of Health; a Global Health Leadership Fellow and has been 'Senior Policy Adviser' to the World Health Organization (WHO), UNAIDS, and The Global Fund.

Relevant to this session: her work in decarbonizing health care is at the forefront of this field. The innovative methods that her team has developed have been vetted and co-branded with WHO, and shared by WHO with all member states. Fawzia has led training for representatives of over 40 countries' Ministries of Health, including Kenya. Her own day-to-day responsibilities include reaching net-zero operations for over 400 facilities and hospitals in 8 countries – all LMICs by 2030. Much of her work is published in peer reviewed journals and her technical and policy advice is highly sought after in this field.

# Kiran Jobanputra leads the Climate Action Accelerator's health programme.

PhD student in Physics | Ecole Normale Supérieure de Paris

Mathieu Lizée is a former student of the Ecole Polytechnique and Ecole Normale Supérieure de Paris, where he studied quantum optics and condensed matter physics.

He started working on mesoscopic properties of 2D disordered superconductors at the Sorbonne Université as a master student. He subsequently shifted his interests towards nanofluidics and is now working as a PhD student in the group of Alessandro Siria and Lydéric Bocquet at the Ecole Normale Supérieure de Paris. Using homemade scanning probe microscopes and transport experiments in nanochannels, he focuses on ion transport at the nanoscale and on liquid–solid interactions.

Aside from physics, he has been giving talks on sustainability and transition, trying to give a physics-based perspective and draw possible directions for the future. For a few weeks now, together with a few other scientists, he is advocating for the environmental transition through the Manhattan project, attempting at accelerating research and industrialisation on the technological side of the transition.
