Professor **Cheikh Mbow** is the Director of the Ecological Monitoring Centre in Senegal. Formerly Director of Future Africa at the University of Pretoria, Cheikh Mbow was Executive Director of START-International in Washington DC and Senior Researcher on Climate Change at the World Agroforestry Centre in Kenya. He is an Associate Professor in the Department of Forestry at Michigan State University. He has led several international research programmes, including Chapter 5 of the IPCC Special Report on Climate Change and Land (SRCCL), and was one of the Lead Authors for Agriculture, Forestry and Other Land Uses (AFOLU) of the IPCC-AR5. Mbow is currently Coordinating Lead Author for the IPCC Special Report on Climate Change and Land, and Lead Author for the IPCC AR6 on AFOLU. He has served on numerous scientific committees, such as the Global Earth Programme (2005-2011), the International Geosphere-Biosphere Programme-IGBP from 2012 to 2014, Future Earth (2013-2015).

Professor Mbow has worked on the drivers of terrestrial resource dynamics in various human-ecological contexts. He has focused on climate impacts and land-related mitigation pathways, food security, land resource opportunities in semi-arid ecosystems. He is currently working on developing transdisciplinary approaches to Africa's development challenges by establishing frameworks for a thriving sustainability science to support the necessary transformation on the continent.

From 2019 to 2021, Jerome took part in the development of the Global Antibiotic Research and Development Partnership (GARDP), a new initiative launched by the World Health Organisation and Drugs for Neglected Disease Initiative, where he held the position of Senior Advisor to the Executive Director.
