Climate Change Impacts

Climate change is exacerbating existing health challenges in West Africa, leading to increased heatwaves, droughts, floods, and vector-borne diseases

Adaptation and Mitigation

1

Air Pollution Sources

Air pollution in West Africa is primarily caused by industrial emissions, vehicle exhaust, and biomass burning for cooking and heating

Health Impacts

Air pollution poses serious health risks, leading to respiratory diseases, cardiovascular problems, and premature mortality

3

Mitigation Strategies

We support initiatives that reduce air pollution through cleaner energy sources, improved transportation systems, and cleaner industrial practices

Planetary Health Campus Ambassadors

The regional hub provides training and mentorship opportunities for young people to develop their leadership skills, build their knowledge of planetary health, and become effective advocates for a sustainable future

Creating Opportunities

The hub fosters collaborations between young people and established experts to create opportunities for intergenerational learning, knowledge sharing, and the co-creation of solutions

4

Building a Network

By connecting young leaders across the region, the hub creates a powerful network of changemakers who can share ideas, collaborate on projects, and amplify their voices for planetary health

Initiatives from West Africa Regional Hub: Policy Advocacy and Shaping a Sustainable Future

Policy Area	Action
Climate Change Mitigation	Promote policies that reduce greenhouse gas emissions and transition to renewable energy sources
Biodiversity Conservation	Support policies that protect ecosystems, conserve species, and promote sustainable land management practices
Health Equity	Advocate for policies that address the health impacts of environmental degradation and ensure access to healthcare for all
